

LIVING IN THE WORD THIS WEEK

Matthew 18:15-35

1. Discuss the context of these verses. Why are these words important for the disciples to grasp about living in the kingdom? Are they applicable to us today?
2. A characteristic of a disciple is his commitment to follow the course of discipline outlined in reaching out to a brother living in sin. Discuss Galatians 6:1-13 and its implications for this process.
3. Confrontation, confirmation, communication to the church—what is the goal of these steps and how are they to be carried out? Should this characterize how we resolve issues with a brother within the body of Christ? Why or why not?
4. The treatment of an unrepentant brother is defined in strong words. How does this make you feel? How would you do your part in carrying this out?
5. Discuss “binding” and “loosing”. What is the correlation between what we do on earth and what God has done in heaven as disciples carrying out His instructions.
6. Unity and agreement in prayer apply to this context in what way? Are there more general applications of this principle? If so, how might they apply?
7. What is a forgiving spirit? How often should it be exercised? How is our forgiveness of others linked to Christ’s forgiveness of us? Why is this so difficult? (consider the parable of the “Unmerciful Servant”)
